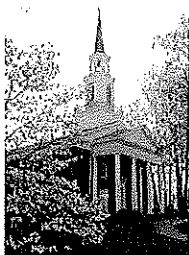

### Advent and Christmas Services

December is my favorite month of worship. The lighting of the Advent candles, along with the hanging of the greens, sets a peaceful and hopeful mood. The characters remembered in worship are fascinating. And since I have been reformed from a Scrooge-like liturgical purist ("Christmas Carols are for the 12 days of Christmas...and I guess Christmas Eve too!") to rejoicing in the combination of Advent and fitting Christmas Carols, worship is that much more joyful.




It is very important that we recover and present the eschatological (end-times) and apocalyptic (revelatory) hope of Advent not only in December but throughout the year. Jesus was, after all, the prophet of the end of all ages and the very revelation of what that perfectly blessed time will look like. At the same time, I believe God is calling us to make use of our culture's early excitement about Christmas during the month of December and draw lovers of classic Christmas carols into the church throughout the month. I will always remember a blessed member of the church suggesting that early December without carols is reminiscent of C.S. Lewis' Narnia when it was "always winter but never Christmas."


With this in mind you can look forward to the following carols on Advent/ Christmas Sundays:

Dec. 7<sup>th</sup>-- Good Christian Friends Rejoice, O Come O Come Emmanuel. This service remembers the wild prophet and cousin of Jesus, John the Baptist.

Dec. 14<sup>th</sup>-- O Little Town of Bethlehem, Joy to the World, In the Bleak Midwinter

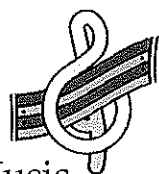


### Brighter Christmas Trees

Our church orchestra is scheduled to play at the 9:30 service on the following dates this year: December 14, January 11, March 8, and May 3. The orchestra is open to all

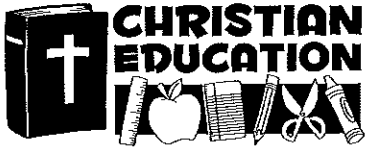

Kathy Meyers and Eileen Morris each sewed mittens at a later date. It was a wonderful project.

Needle Nite will be meeting on November 7 to make gift bags that will be filled small toiletries at the December meeting and then given to the Community Support Project in Plainfield which will give them to the residents at the Park Hotel. The meeting on

December 5<sup>th</sup> will be in the dining room to enjoy shared refreshments while filling the gifts bags. The goal is to make and fill 100 bags. All are welcome to come and see what is being done and or to join the group.

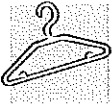

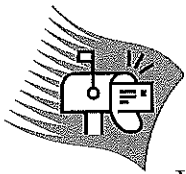


### Thrift Shop Success Leads to \$14,000 in Charitable Donations
